Composition/Ingredients Information

Definition: Obtained by pressing the peels of the unripe fruits of *Citrus aurantium* L. subsp. *Bergamia* (Risso et Poit), followed by rectification, to produce an oil that is free from furanocoumarins.

Hazards Identification

R10 flammable.

First Aid Measures

Inhalation: Remove from exposure site to fresh air. Keep at rest. Obtain medical attention.

Eye contact: flush immediately with plenty of cold water for at least 15 minutes. Contact a doctor if symptoms persist.

Skin contact: Remove contaminated clothes. Wash thoroughly with soap and water, flush with plenty of water. If irritation persists, seek medical advice.

Ingestion: Rinse mouth out with water. Seek medical advice immediately..

Fire Fighting Measures

Extinguishing media: carbon dioxide, dry chemical, foam.

Unsuitable extinguishers: water jet.

Protective clothing: fire fighters should wear protective clothing and approved respirator.

Accidental Release Measures

Personal precautions: Avoid inhalation and direct contact with skin and eyes. Use individual protective equipment (safety glasses, waterproof-boots, suitable protective clothing) in case of major spillages.

Spillage: Remove ignition sources. Provide adequate ventilation. Avoid excessive inhalation of vapours. Gross spillage should be contained immediately by use of sand or inert powder and disposed of according to local regulations.

Environment precautions: keep away from drains, soils, surface and groundwaters.

Handling & Storage

Handling: apply good manufacturing practice and industrial hygiene practices. Observe good personal hygiene, and do not eat, drink or smoke whilst handling.

Storage: Store in tightly closed original container in a cool, dry and ventilated area away from heat sources and protected from light. Keep air contact to a minimum. Avoid plastic and uncoated metal containers.

Fire protection: keep away from ignition sources and naked flames.

Exposure Controls/Personal Protection

Respiratory protection: Avoid breathing concentrated product vapour.

Ventilation: ensure good ventilation of working area.

Skin protection: avoid skin contact. Use chemically resistant gloves if required.

Eye protection: use safety glasses.

Physical & Chemical Properties

Odour: pleasant fresh fruity.

Colour: green to greenish yellow, sometimes with a deposit.

Appearance: mobile liquid.

Stability & Reactivity

Reactivity: presents no significant reactivity hazard by itself or in contact with water.

Avoid contact with strong acids, alkali or oxidising agents.

Decomposition: carbon monoxide and unidentified organic compounds may be formed during combustion.

Toxicological Information

Not a skin sensitiser. Opdyke DJ (1979) explained the phototoxic effects of Bergamot Oil were due to furanocoumarin content (FCT 11, 1031). LD50 Oral: Rat > 5/kg

Ecological Information

Biodegradability: n/a

Precautions: prevent contamination of soil, ground and surface water.

Disposal Considerations

Avoid excessive disposal to drainage systems and into the environment. Seek expert advice. Observe specific local regulations.
